Word of the Week

Have you ever told a child, "You're not listening!"? You probably meant, "You aren't doing what I asked you to do." This type of listening is about remembering and following directions. The character word for this week is about a different listening skill—listening for UNDERSTANDING. Listening and showing understanding are skills that help children learn to resolve conflicts, make friendships, and show compassion. Children who are understanding are more likely to have strong, healthy relationships.

From the Office

Medications at School: Parents need to renew their children's medication forms every year. If your child had medication administered by school staff last year, you need to submit a new form this year. You will also need to bring in new medication for this year. Health Services disposes of all unused medication at the end of each year.

7th Grade Parents: The SCUSD requires that 2013-2014 seventh grade students have a current Tdap. Please drop your child's immunization form in the main office.

Fingerprinting Requirements: Yes, you do need to be fingerprinted to go on a field trip...whether you are driving children or not...whether you are going by bus or not. The District requires any adult who is not fingerprinted to be in sight of a certificated person at all times, but it is vital that teachers be free to watch their students, not the grown ups who are there to help. So fingerprint please!

Please Remember

When approaching an leaving our campus...We ALL have children to drop off or pick up. We ALL have places we need to go. But the most importantly ALL of us need to be safe and courteous. Good behavior under pressure is a great lesson for the children in your car to witness.

And please do not block driveways, walk on lawns or run the stop signs in our neighborhood!

How Much Will Your Trip to Disneyland Cost LdV?

Unexcused absences (any school day missed for reasons other than illness, doctor's appointment, death in family or religious reasons) costs LdV almost \$45. That means a 5 day trip costs \$225 and if you decide to take both your kids...

Notice of Pesticide/Herbicide Use LdV is scheduled for service by SCUSD's Small Grass Crew every Wednesday. The crew may or may not spray every Wednesday. If they do spray, they will post notice in the front lower window of the front door. A copy of SCUSD's Pest Management Program listing all chemicals applied to all sites is available in the front office.

From the SCL (School Community Liaison)

Badges: Every parent on campus must sign in to the main office. If you are working anywhere on campus get a "Volunteer" badge and sign in the Volunteer book. If you are visiting a classroom, please sign in the book under Mona Lisa and wear a "Visitor" badge. Please sign out in the appropriate book before leaving. These precautions are for the safety of everyone on campus.

Tally Sheets: A September tally sheet was in your first day packet. Please turn it into your child's class or to the Volunteer Office at the end of the month.

Carry Over Hours: Hours from 2012-13 are only carried over to this year if they were worked AFTER May 15, 2013 (and <u>turned in</u>). Thank you to every parent who worked over their required hours last year (most of you). Our program shines because of you!

First Pay Packets: Please complete your first day packet and return them to the classroom as soon as possible. Extra forms can be found in the front office.

TB test results and Sex Offender Background check clearances: Must be on file before working in the classroom. Fingerprinting must be cleared before driving on or chaperoning fieldtrips.

Late to School?

Students who are over 30 minutes tardy must be accompanied to the main office by their parent or guardian to obtain a tardy slip. All tardies over 30 minutes must have a parent signature or an official doctors note. Three tardies over 30 minutes without such documentation will result in a truancy notice.

Free TB Testing

Tests taken this year will be "good" until 2017. Testing is done by the District at the Serna Center every other week from 3:30 to 5 pm. It's a two step process: given on Tuesday and read on Thursday. The schedule is in your first day packet.

Call In Sick and Tardy

Please phone in your students' absences and tardies by calling 557-0389 wait for the message to begin and then press 49#. Leave the child's name, room number, date of absence and reason for being out of school (i.e.: illness, doctor appointment, religious, out of town, death in family). Absence verification must be made daily.

You may also send your notification by email to sally-uhlig@scusd.edu. Unverified absences will result in truancies.

President's Ponderings

Hello again! This week I would like to tell you about the amazing Learning Garden we have at LdV, and the fabulous work done by Jeri Clark and her Garden Committee, including cochairs Alysia Nordberg and Greg Richards. Hopefully you were able to attend the Stepping Stones work day last Friday. But if not, don't worry. There are plenty of opportunities to help in the Garden!

The LdV Learning Garden is located at the end of the Primary Grades (eK-3rd) wing, next to the playground. If you are new to LdV, or a Kinder family, you owe it to yourself to walk down there and check it out. Ten years ago that patch of ground was overgrown with weeds, with a few broken down planter boxes. Led by alumni parent and sometime-substitute teacher Judy Painter, Jeri Clark and others set about transforming not just how the space looked. but how it was used. They not only cleaned the space and planted in-ground beds, but also worked with teachers to incorporate the garden into the curriculum. In addition to setting up a basic irrigation system, they also made the garden produce available in the cafeteria (even when the school district made it difficult). And along with constructing new planter boxes, tables, benches, and a brand new cleaning station, they opened the garden up to the children at recess, and before and after school. Now you can often find as many as 50 children enjoying the garden during these times. A truly transformational endeavor.

This year Jeri and her team are working to take the Learning Garden to the next level. Along with a variety of grants, the PTC this year has pledged \$2,500 to help make garden improvements. But we need your help and there are a number of ways you can participate. Perhaps you are available to staff the garden during school recess time. If so there is a training session this Tuesday (9/24) at 2:30pm. Or perhaps you or someone in your family knows how to install irrigation systems - we are upgrading again and need volunteers. Or perhaps you would like to find a way to help your child's teacher incorporate the garden into their classroom curriculum. If you don't already have one, volunteer to be the Garden Rep for your room. To learn more about these opportunities, and others, I encourage you to attend the Garden Committee open house this Wednesday evening 9/25 from 6:30-8pm. And be sure


