
Boxtops Contest Time!!!

From the SCL (School Community Liaison)

Badges: Every parent on campus must sign in to the main office. If you are working anywhere on campus get a "Volunteer" badge and sign in the Volunteer book. If you are visiting a classroom, please sign in the book under Mona Lisa and wear a "Visitor" badge. Please sign out in the appropriate book before leaving. These precautions are for the safety of everyone on campus.

Tally Sheets: January tally sheets are due! Please turn it into your child's class or to the Volunteer Office. Tally sheets are available in the front office and on the LdV website.

Remember!: January 30 was the due date for 20 parent hours!

TB test results and Sex Offender Background check clearances: Must be on file before working in the classroom. Fingerprinting must be cleared before driving on or chaperoning fieldtrips.

Please Remember

When approaching an leaving our campus...We ALL have children to drop off or pick up. We ALL have places we need to go. But the most importantly ALL of us need to be safe and courteous. Good behavior under pressure is a great lesson for the children in your car to witness.

Fingerprinting Requirements

Yes, you do need to be fingerprinted to go on a field trip...whether you are driving children or not...whether you are going by bus or not. The District requires any adult who is not fingerprinted to be in sight of a certificated person at all times, but it is vital that teachers be free to watch their students, not the grown ups who are there to help. So fingerprint please!

Driving on a Field Trip?

The district requirements for insurance (when driving kids on field trips) are as follows: minimum of liability \$50,000/\$100.000 and property is minimum \$25,000.






How do I Order and Receive My Tickets & Corsages?



Bring a Doctor's Note If your child misses school for a visit to the Doctor or Dentist, please bring a school excuse note for their attendance. It does make a difference on a student's attendance report. The attendance code for a Doctor's visit is "M" which is unlimited and without the doctor's note it is an "A". Students are allowed 10 excused (illness with a parent's excuse, death in immediate family, child's appearance in court) absences per the year. Each additional absence from illness must have a doctor's note to be cleared.

Leave a Reason We are asking that you email you child's absence report to sally-uhlig@ scusd.edu as early as possible (before 10 a.m.). Please use "attendance" in the subject line and include the child's name, teacher, room number and the date of illness and/or tardy, and the reason. The reason is very important but does not need to be detailed; a simple "She/he is sick today" will suffice. You will receive a confirmation email. Many parents report absences stating their child will be absent, but do not state the "REASON" please remember to so.

Wondering about attendance codes? P = Personal absence – Education Code section 46014 is for: student's court appearance {requires verification}, funeral services {one day, in state...three days, out of state; need verification such as a funeral program or name and address of the funeral home}, parent's employment conference {requires prior principal approval}, student is the custodial parent of a child who is ill or has a medical appointment during school hours. Observance of a religious holiday or ceremony (recommend 3 days advance notice to school).

Did You Know...When your child has chicken pox, a skin rash, lice or other infectious health challenges you need to follow up with the main office when your child returns to campus. A doctor's note that the child has been treated and is okay to be back among our other students after a rash or chicken pox is required by SCUSD health services.

Late to School? Students who are over 30 minutes tardy must be accompanied to the main office by their parent or guardian to obtain a tardy slip. All tardies over 30 minutes must have a parent signature or an official doctors note. Three tardies over 30 minutes without such documentation will result in a truancy notice.

Check Your Child's Schedule The lunch and recess schedules for all grade levels are readily available on the school website (leonardodavincischool.org). If you are picking your child up for an appointment, or bringing a lunch they left behind, it is easier and quicker to find them in class than on the playground. Please consider timing your trip around your child's schedule. Thank you.

Please Bring Your ID If you are taking your child for early dismissal or are sending someone from your emergency card list, please note ID will be required. It is school policy to show proper ID before a student is released. It is for the safety of your child, please do not grouse at the staff who are keeping our children safe!

Badges Every parent on campus must sign in to the main office. If you are working anywhere on campus get a "Volunteer" badge and sign in the Volunteer book. If you are visiting a classroom, please sign in the book under Mona Lisa and wear a "Visitor" badge. Please sign out in the appropriate book before leaving. Medications at School Parents need to renew their children's medication forms every year. If your child had medication administered by school staff last year, you need to submit a new form this year. 



Where can I take the ATS Qualifying Exam?

AT YOUR SCHOOL:

During 2013-2014, over 10,700 students from 577 schools took the *College Ability Test*. Check with your school to see if they are offering the exam. A \$15 processing fee is payable on the day of the test at school sites.

AT SACRAMENTO STATE:

Testing is also available at Sac State on the following Saturdays: January 31, February 21, February 28, and March 14. A \$15 processing fee is payable the day of the test. Contact ATS to reserve your place.

Costs and Financial Aid

ATS is a non-profit, self-supporting organization and receives no University, federal, or state funding. In 2014, course fees for the 6th-9th grade program ranged from \$149 to \$439, depending on the length of the course. For the 4th/5th grade week-long sessions, course fees were \$335.

Over \$45,000 in financial aid scholarships and fee waivers was granted to students last year. Financial aid information will be included in the 2015 Catalog, which will be available online in March 2015.





Dear Parents/Guardians:

Thank you for allowing us to partner with you in educating your child. As a district, we continue to strive for success for every student. This is to inform you that Sacramento City Unified School District continues as a Program Improvement (PI) local educational agency (LEA) in Year 3, corrective action.

The Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA), also known as the No Child Left Behind (NCLB) Act of 2001, requires the California Department of Education (CDE) to annually review the student academic performance in English-language arts (ELA) and mathematics of each school district that receives funds under Title-I. A school district is identified as PI if it fails to meet yearly student performance goals, known as Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP), for two consecutive years.

On March 7, 2014, the U.S. Department of Education approved California's testing waiver for certain requirements of Title I, Part A of the ESEA. A one-year waiver was granted that allows flexibility in making AYP determinations for schools and LEAs participating in the Smarter Balanced Field Test.

The California Department of Education did **not** produce a 2014 AYP Report for elementary and middle schools plus school districts. Therefore, the PI status for elementary and middle schools as well as school districts did not change. These schools and districts did not enter or exit PI. However, they will continue to implement the PI requirements associated with their current PI status.

The ESEA also requires the California State Board of Education (SBE) to determine a corrective action for each PI Year-3 school district. Corrective action the collective name given to the steps the district must take that directly respond to instructional, managerial, and organizational problems that will lead to students achieving proficiency in the core academic subjects of ELA and mathematics. As a continuing PI Year-3, Corrective Action district, Sacramento City Unified School District must continue to implement the following corrective action(s):

- Institute and fully implement SBE-adopted standards and aligned curricula in ELA and mathematics.
- Revise the LEA Plan, as necessary, to document steps to fully implement the SBE-assigned corrective action; consult with parents/guardians and school staff when revising and implementing the LEA Plan, which include information on how Title-I and other funds will be used to improve student achievement; and continue to post the approved LEA Plan on district Web site.

 Demonstrate progress of LEA Plan implementation and monitoring by submitting a report describing the LEA's progress towards implementation of the strategies and actions in the LEA plan through annual electronic submission of local evidence to the CDE.

Parents and/or guardians, your continued support is vital and welcomed. Below are some suggestions that you may use to assist the district on this improvement journey.

- Talk with district staff about the LEA Plan and the revisions that must be made to help students meet the state standards in ELA and mathematics.
- Visit your child's school. You also may participate in voluntary activities to assist your school or district.
- If you are a parent of a student who attends a Title-I PI school, ask about school choice options to transfer your child, with paid transportation, to a public school in the district that is not identified as a PI school. Applications will be available in early 2015 for the 2015-16 school year.
- If you are a parent of a student who attends a Title-I school that has been in PI for two years or more, ask about supplemental educational services, or free tutoring, that may be available for your child. Applications for the 2015-16 school year will be available in September 2015.

This process is for those families choosing not to attend their neighborhood school.

The Open Enrollment process is an opportunity for each student who resides permanently within the boundaries of the Sacramento City Unified School District to apply for enrollment in participating **elementary schools** within the district, **based on space availability** for the **2015-2016** school year. Parents or guardians will need to complete an application in order for their children to attend the "school of choice" requested.

- Application Process and Open Enrollment Dates: Parents/guardians of elementary school students interested in open enrollment can apply on-line or in person.
 - Parents will be able to access the 24 hour on-line application at <u>www.scusd.edu</u> Open Enrollment link beginning at 8:00 a.m. Tuesday, February 17 until 5:00 p.m. Tuesday, March 3, 2015.
 - If you wish to apply in-person, you may do so at the Enrollment Center located at 5601 47th Avenue. The in-person application period will be held on:

Wednesday, February 25, 2015 9 a.m. - 3 p.m.

- 2. <u>Lottery Process:</u> Open Enrollment is not a first-come, first-serve basis. Open Enrollment uses a computerized lottery system to place students at their school of choice. A lottery must be implemented if applications exceed the grade capacity at the requested school. If your child isn't selected during this step, he/she will be placed on a waiting list. If space becomes available, you will be contacted by the Enrollment Center administration.
- Lottery Placement Notification: Letters of lottery placement notification will be mailed home by the end
 of March 2015. Upon notification, parents are required to complete student registration at the Enrollment
 Center during the period of Monday, April 6 Friday, April 17, 2015.
- 4. <u>Elementary School Specialized Programs:</u> Students seeking to apply for a specialized program must contact the elementary school and/or visit the school website regarding specific criteria requirements.
