1) Set-Up: 7:30 am - 9:30 am





Qur first graders are quite the little bakers! Here is a recipe that all 93 students made in addition to working in the garden, planting and harvesting! Try this recipe with your family-it's simple, delicious and great for all ages!!! A special thank you to all the volunteers who made our cooking and gardening day possible!

Simple Sweet Scones

2-1/2 cups all purpose flour

1 Tablespoon flour

½ tsp salt

8 Tablespoons cold unsalted butter, cut up

14 cup granulated sugar

2/3 cup milk

Preheat oven to 425

Put flour, baking powder and salt in a large bowl; stir to mix well. Add butter and cut in with a fork or rub with your fingers, until the mixture looks like fine granules.

Add sugar: toss to mix. Add milk and stir with fork until dough forms. Form dough into a ball and divide into 10-12 balls.

Place scones on an ungreased cookie sheet and sprinkle with sugar.

Bake 12 minutes or until medium brown on top. Serve with fresh berries and homemade whipped cream!

Homemade Whipped Cream

½ cup chilled heavy whipping cream

2 tsp granulated sugar

½ tsp vanilla

Place the ingredients in a jar with a fitted lid(mason jar or jar with screw on top). Shake vigorously for 4-6 minutes. The cream will begin to solidify. Stop shaking when you have the desired whipped cream texture!
