Extracurricular Eligibility (extended day, athletics, assemblies, etc)

In order to participate in school-sponsored extracurricular activities and/or events, a student must maintain a C average (2.0 G.P.A.) and satisfactory citizenship. Students with more than two failing grades will not be eligible to try-out or play for any LdV team. Students with two failing grades may practice half-time with the team, but not play in any games. Before participating in a school-sponsored event, a student and a parent or guardian must sign an agreement to abide by these requirements. Failure to meet all requirements will cause the student to be ineligible to participate during the week following such failure. Only eligible students will be dismissed from class to attend any school-sponsored event.

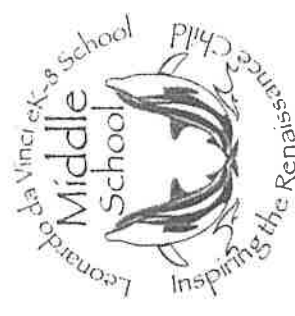
